## Sweet Christmas Recipes



### BRENDA JONE'S RED VELVET CAKE

1 1/2 C Sugar      2 C Oil  
2 Eggs              1 tsp. vinegar  
1 oz. red food coloring   1 tsp. salt

2 1/2 C flour (Cake or plain)      1 tsp. baking soda  
2 tbsp cocoa      1 C buttermilk      1 tsp vanilla

Cream sugar & oil, add eggs and beat. Add vinegar & food coloring & beat well. Sift dry ingredients, add to creamed ingredients with milk and vanilla, beat well. Bake 350\* for 30 -35 minutes Let cool and frost

### CREAM CHEESE FROSTING

1 stick margarine      1 - 8oz. cream cheese softened  
1 tsp. vanilla, 1 box 4x confection sugar, 1 C chopped Pecans

Beat margarine, vanilla and cream cheese until soft. Gradually add sugar and pecans. Frost cooled cake.

### OLD FASHIONED POUND CAKE

1 C butter, softened  
2 C sugar  
6 eggs  
2 C all - purpose flour, sifted  
1 tsp vanilla

Preheat oven to 300\*. Cream butter and sugar until fluffy. Add eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition. Sift flour and add to creamed mixture. Add vanilla. Grease & flour a tube pan. Pour cake batter into tube pan and bake for 1 hour and 20 minutes at 300 degrees. Sift confection sugar atop after cake has cooled. YEILD: 20 - 25 servings



### 7-UP CAKE

1/2 C shortening      1/2 C margarine  
2 1/2 C sugar      5 eggs      3 C all - purpose flour  
1 C 7-up      1 tsp vanilla      1 1/2 tsp lemon flavoring

Preheat oven 325\*. Cream shortening, butter and sugar. Beat in eggs. Add flour alternately with 7-Up and flavorings. Bake in a greased floured tube pan for 1 hour and 20 minutes. YEILD 20 servings

### HOLIDAY TRAVEL TIPS

Traveling across country or across town, it is important to keep safety in mind. Getting there could actually be half the fun!

Have a trip plan and let others know when you will leave and intend to arrive at your destination.

Have a cellular telephone with you if possible.

Keep your car doors locked and windows rolled up.

At stop signs or traffic signals, keep a safe distance from the car in front of you. Leave yourself room to get out in case you're boxed in.

Don't stop in under populated areas to ask directions. Travel well-lighted and busy streets.

Do not pick up hitchhikers.

Lock your doors when you leave your car, even if it's for a short time.

Don't advertise that you're from out-of-town by pulling over to the curb to read a road map.

When you get out of your car, carry your purse and keep other valuables out of sight. Do not store valuables out in the open inside a parked car.

Raise the hood and tie a handkerchief to the aerial or door handle.

If a roadside telephone or call-box is handy, use it. If not, sit in your locked car and wait for help.

Remember, you are your best protection. If you follow these steps, you'll be protecting the most important part of your car - YOU.
