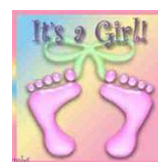

Preparing for and riding in Hot / Humid Weather

Heat Stroke – is a life-threatening condition that occurs when your body temperature reaches 104 F (40 C) or higher. Heatstroke can be brought on by high environmental temperatures, by strenuous physical activity or by other conditions that raise your body temperature. Whatever the cause, you'll need immediate medical attention to prevent brain damage, organ failure or death.

Heatstroke is the escalation of two other heat-related health problems: heat cramps and heat exhaustion. In these conditions, you develop signs and symptoms that are milder than those of heatstroke. You can prevent heatstroke if you receive medical attention or take self-care steps as soon as you notice problems.

Heat Exhaustion – is a condition whose symptoms may include heavy sweating and a rapid pulse, a result of your body overheating. It's one of three heat-related syndromes, with heat cramps being the mildest and heatstroke being the most severe. Causes of heat exhaustion include exposure to high temperatures, particularly when combined with high humidity, and strenuous physical activity. Without prompt treatment, heat exhaustion can progress to heatstroke, a life-threatening condition. Fortunately, heat exhaustion is preventable.

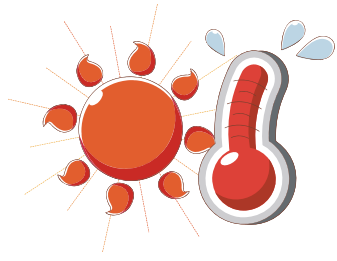
Heat Cramps- Heat cramps are muscle pains or spasms - usually in the abdomen, arms, or legs - that may occur in association with strenuous activity. If you have heart problems or are on a low sodium diet, get medical attention for heat cramps.

Heat cramps usually affect people who sweat a lot during strenuous activity. This sweating depletes the body's salt and moisture. The low salt level in the muscles causes painful cramps. Heat cramps may also be a symptom of heat exhaustion.

- You can start with hydration. The body needs plenty of water to stay cool. Let's face it, there is going to be a lot of sweat involved in hot weather riding if you are a man. Woman do not sweat, they glisten. (A lesson I had to learn) Regardless of gender it is important that we consume the proper amount of water. Sweat is the body's natural way of trying to stay cool.

- You should begin to hydrate a day or two before your trip. Trying to hydrate the morning of the big trip is too late.

- If you are riding and your lips and mouth become dry you are already dehydrated. At that point it becomes very difficult to catch back up.
- You have to make more frequent stops and constantly push the fluids. Sodas, coffee, tea anything that contains caffeine are considered diuretics...they cause you to lose fluids. Water or a Gatorade type fluid is preferred....Of course drinking more fluids will cause more frequent stopping if you know what we mean.....
- Do not forget the medications you are taking which can also contribute to not only dehydration, but a reduction in one's ability to tolerate heat and humidity, even sunlight. With that in mind some illnesses and conditions like diabetes will reduce your tolerance to heat.
- While in the Mom and Pops stores (during one of your frequent stops) spend a little time standing in front of open cooler doors or at least in the air conditioning.
- Talk about cool vest or cooling apparatuses / devices. They do come in all shapes and sizes as well as price ranges. You can mention soaking your shirt or a bandana for your neck in cold water and allowing evaporation to provide cooling.
- Remind them that riding in full gear (within reason...mesh or cotton long sleeves instead of leather, etc) is cooler than riding in short sleeve shirts or shorts. Exposed skin will allow wind and sun to remove moisture from the skin surface and work against the body's natural cooling system.....sweating. This leads to sunburn/ windburn and once again a reduced ability for the body to sweat. Imagine getting sunburned on the first day of a multi-day trip and the hardships that adds to an already stressful situation.
- Preplanning can help. Try to travel in the early morning hours which are normally the coolest and get off the road by noon as the afternoon temperatures will be the hottest of the day.
- Pay close attention to all of your traveling partners for the signs of heat stress and heat stroke. Heat stroke can kill. Look up the signs and present them if you so desire.

Plan ahead and ride safe. Your life depends on it.
